

To help children have a good education **NICCY** wants Government to:

1. Give schools the money and help they need

Schools should have the money to give children the education that is best for them, especially when children are young or need extra support.

2. Agree on a fair way for children to transfer from primary to secondary or grammar schools

Last year Government stopped the 11+ and said tests should not decide which school children go to, but there are still tests for some schools. NICCY has talked to lots of children about this and put their views in a special report.

3. Make sure children have a say in school life

Children should have the chance to be involved in things like school councils, so they can have a say in decisions about their education.
