- Make sure children have more stability in their lives
  It is not fair if children have to keep changing where they live
  and who they live with, like Alistair. They should also be looked
  after by the same professionals, like social workers and staff in
  children's homes.
- Give more help to teenagers as they become adults

  It is important that teenagers in care get all the help they need with education, finding a job and learning how to live by themselves as they become adults.
- Make sure children have a say in decisions about them Independent advocates should be there when decisions are made about children's lives. They are adults whose job is to make sure children know what is happening and have their say.
