## WHATS GOING ON IN NI?



- Some children are being left behind and not reaching their potential.
- Children with special educational needs need the right help, faster.
- Schools should **stop using seclusion** on pupils and only ever use **physical restraint as a last resort** to keep people safe.
- Children's **well-being should be a priority**, especially after the pandemic.
- Schools need more support to **tackle bullying**, including online.
- As the last UN report said, all pupils should have age appropriate relationship and sexuality education.
- 90% of children and young people are educated in **segregated schools**. It is important that all schools meet the needs of all pupils.



## WHAT SHOULD GOVERNMENT DO NOW? Close the gap in achievement between some groups of children and young people so there are no barriers in an education system that fully supports their rights. Promote and check mental health and wellbeing of children and young people in schools. Move towards a single education system that is fit for purpose, value for money and doesn't cost families extra money. Make sure the effect of the Covid pandemic on children and young people doesn't have an ongoing effect on their education. Make sure Seclusion is no longer used and restraint is only used as a last resort when the child or others are at risk, and that this is recorded and reported, and parents fully informed.
