CONTEXT

- A time of excitement devolution and a new NI Assembly
- A new Department Office of the First Minister and deputy First Minister
- The Human Rights Act 1998
 - Coming into force Oct 2000
- A Human Rights Unit established
 - To promote a culture of rights and responsibilities within government departments;
 - To prepare for implementation of the Human Rights Act in NI
 - Introduced a new 'lens' of 'rights and responsibilities'



AN ALIGNMENT OF THE PLANETS

- Well developed and influential voluntary and community sector
- The influence of Trond Waage!
- Transition from human rights to children's rights specifically
- Visit to Norway to see it in operation
- The result: approval for a Commissioner for Children and Young People and a 10 year Strategy



TAKING IT FORWARD

Commissioner for Children and Young People (NI) Order 2003

- Order in Council made at Westminster
- Office created to 'safeguard and promote the rights and best interests of children and young people'

Issues

- Extent of the powers given
- Inclusion of non-devolved bodies within remit

Consultation

- More of a partnership



MAKING THE APPOINTMENT

- A new role which called for a new process!
- Regulated by the Commissioner for Public Appointments
- Central involvement of young people
 - Role plays
 - Participated in interview panel
- The result: the appointment of Nigel Williams in October 2003
- 10 years on: I'm proud to be associated with NICCY!
